

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE PORT ELIZABETH BRANCH OF THE S.A.R.L. HELD AT COTSWOLD SCOUT HALL ON SATURDAY 10TH SEPTEMBER 1988.

PRESENT: 61 members and visitors. APOLOGIES:14 members.

The Chairman welcomed all to the meeting, especially Ewan ZR2AAR from Grahamstown, the ladies, children and visitors.

The meeting stood in silence to commemorate the passing of 3 branch members during the year, Bette ZS2ID, Cyril ZS2KX and Cliff ZS2AP. Cyril would be sorely missed as neutral chairman during the election of Committee.

#### CHAIRMANS REPORT.

Quite an eventful year was 1988-1989! And how it seemed to speed by! It really seems like just yesterday that the Branch held its last AGM and I was elected as Chairman.

Several happenings of note took place during the year, not the least momentous being the amalgamation of the Algoa and Port Elizabeth branches into one unit working together for the benefit of local members, renewing old friendships and making new. The amalgamation was achieved after a postal ballot to which the majority agreed. The use of the name of Port Elizabeth Branch, which has been in existence for more than 60 years, since the inception of the League was also agreed to. The Chairman of the Algoa Branch Al ZS2U accepted a position on the combined Committee and has the portfolio of Hamnet Liaison. The first combined meeting was followed by a welcoming party.

One other happening, which took place amidst great controversy both locally and in other areas, was the move of Headquarters from Cape Town to Johannesburg, with Councillors being elected from all areas. The introduction of a free QSL bureau, and the promise of many other benefits have been made by the new Council and we wish them success and continued growth, without the necessity for increasing subscriptions to the point where members will leave in large numbers.

Other events of note were: the winning of the Field Day contest by a very wide margin; our JOTA station being largely instrumental in the local Scout group being awarded the first prize offered by Otis for the best Scout event nationally; the very successful communications set-up with about 20 operators at the VW/Algoa motor rally; the Marconi Day exhibition which was fairly well attended in spite of inclement weather; the visit of Michael Meerman GO/PA3BHF who participated in the Ski Trek across the Arctic continent and gave a talk and slide show; a Sunday lunch at Wyndomayne Gardens and a caravan rally at the Sea Acres Park. We would love to see more members and their families at the social events.

Meetings were very well attended and included a visit to the Physics Department of U.P.E., talks by Ken ZS2OC on Hamnet and Emergency services, Bud ZS2CA spoke on and demonstrated Cardio -Pulmonary Resuscitation; Ray ZR2BF spoke on Post Office communications past, present and future; Brian ZS2AB demonstrated

the Weather fax station and Lynne ZS2MM presented an amusing and interesting  $\operatorname{quiz}\nolimits.$ 

The Repeater Working Group, under the Chairmanship of Trevor ZS2AE, were hard at work much of the time on repairs and updating and a 6 metre repeater was set up on Ladys Slipper. The Sunday bulletins now include an Update in the evening and many thanks are due to Mike ZS2FM for his contributions of useful and interesting information on the VHF spectrum. Al ZS2U, Ken ZS2OC and Stoffel ZS2C have prepared an operating position at the Civil Telence Centre including erecting antennas, for which many thanks. Dick ZS2RS and Wolf ZS2WC organised both the Field Day Contests which fell in this League von.

Thanks are due to our Treasurer Colin ZSZCTR for his officensh bookkeeping and handling of the Branchs funds which have grown very nicely. The operation of the R3O draw at meetings have helped in this respect. The other members of the Committee have all played their part in the smooth running of the Branch and special thanks are due to them as well. We lost our Secretary Owen ZSZHZ due to the family leaving for the U.K. and Dick ZSZRS stepped into the breach.

QSX-PE continues to be published and thanks are due to members who contribute articles or other items of interest, and also to those members who provided numerous articles for Radio-ZS. #### BRANCH TROPHIES.

ZS2AB CONSTRUCTORS TROPHY. Silver floating trophy.

This trophy is awarded on an annual basis to the member who, in the opinion of the Committee, has constructed the best piece of radio or associated equipment during the branch year. The unit submitted may form part of a complete system employing others of commercially made equipment, but commercial kits will not be eligible for the award. While there is no restriction on the type of equipment, preference will be given to items relating to the more specialised modes of communication available to the amateur. Neatness of layout, finish and wiring will be taken into account and the degree of electronic sophistication will not necessarily determine the winner. This trophy is made available in the hope that it will spur some of our members on in the field of home construction, an aspect of amateur radio which seems to be sadly becoming a thing of the past.

### ZS2OB DX TROPHY. Silver floating trophy.

This trophy is awarded on an annual basis to the member, who in the opinion of the Committee, has established two-way contact with the greatest number of DX stations on the HF bands during the branch year. This trophy must be applied for and it will be necessary to scrutinise the log books. QSL cards are not necessary. All frequencies and modes are eligible for the award.

VHF TROPHY. Silver floating trophy.

This trophy is awarded to a member or members of the Branch who prove outstanding achievements on any or all of the VHF bands. Proof must be submitted to the Committee.

### DF HUNTING TROPHY. Silver floating trophy.

This trophy will be awarded to the member who is the overall winner of any DF Hunts organised by the Branch. Future DF Hunts will carry a points system for trophy purposes. It is hoped that at least several DF Hunts will be held during the year.

#### HAM SPIRIT TROPHY.

This trophy is awarded at the discretion of the Committee to the member who has consistently demonstrated a willingness to become involved in activities relating to the Branch or who shows a genuine attitude of friendliness and help to members or at Branch level.


