
The event will take the form of a bring and braai, with Neville kindly providing the fires and braai facilities.

SA RADIO LEAGUE HAPPENINGS

SARL HAS NEW PRESIDENT

In his annual report, delivered at the AGM, outgoing President Chris Turner said he felt the time was ripe for a change in leadership, having had three years each as Vice-President and President. Although he was happy to remain on as a Councillor, he had decided to lay down the reins and make way for new blood.

After the AGM, Council unanimously elected Hans Potgieter ZS6ALJ, President and Sid Tyler ZS6AYC Vice President.

PEARS congratulates Hans and Sid on their appointment and trusts that their efforts to revive the League will be met with great and lasting success.

Perhaps with many new, and hopefully free-thinking, councillors and a new-guard President, the "ghosts of Councils past" can be laid to rest and there will be a return to that relaxed esprit de corps that was once the hallmark of amateur radio throughout the country.

We express our thanks to Chris Turner ZS6GM for his unstinting efforts during his term of office. He took over at a very difficult time in the League's history and burned barrels of midnight oil pursuing the interests of the League and Amateur Radio.

We hope that his move from the "hot seat" to the "back burner" will afford him a little more time for his other activities and responsibilities.

The SARL's new HQ building was opened officially on 23 April and, from various comments heard on the bands, it is a practical yet attractive edifice and should satisfy the SARL's needs for now

Some 1200 people are reported to have passed through the gates on the Saturday, mainly to get to the flea market and exhibits by various suppliers of ham-related equipment, or to attend the fascinating demonstrations by Tony ZS6CCD or the discussions on other facets of ham radio.

Council's motion for the inclusion,

without option, of Radio ZS and the QSL Bureau facilities in the basic subscription package was carried unanimously. Strangely, last year, a similar motion from PE was thrown out!

The SARL subscriptions for 1999/2000, which include Radio ZS and the use of the Bureau (presumably with a basic limit) will be as follows:

The "Junior" category of membership has been withdrawn. Such members are now grouped in the Nontransmitting category.

The inclusion of Radio ZS as part of the basic package means, in theory, that nearly 50% more members will receive it than the mere thousand or so who have subscribed to the magazine up to now (the League had 1486 paidup members at the date of the AGM).

CB TO 6 METRE TRANSVERTER

ANDRÉ BOTES, ZS2ACP

This project secured a second place in the SAARDT competition at ARA99. Only one prize was originally intended but the decision was so close that the judges decided to award a second prize of R250 for André's entry.

t recently became evident, with the tremendous meteor scatter propagation on 50 MHz, how many people were interested in 6 metres but could not join in the fun because they only had FM transceivers or no 6 metre equipment at all.

This easy modification will allow the homebrewer to construct an external transverter to be used in conjunction with an SSB CB set to which no major modifications have to be done at all!

The mixer circuit described here is similar to that used for the 7 MHz


conversion (see RADIO ZS, October 1997 and April 1998) but with important differences in the tuned circuits and choice of crystal. The sum of the CB frequency plus the mixer's crystal frequency will determine where in the 6 metre band you will come out.

Note that this project is intended to drive a recycled commercial or other VHF amplifier that you will need to acquire yourself. It should have a pre-driver stage of its own since the output from this unit's pre-driver is very low — only a couple of milliwatts.

Since a 40 channel CB set will give you 400 kHz coverage in the band, choose a crystal that will place you in the segment of the 6 metre band where you wish to operate. (As the DX section is in the low part of the band, i.e. 50,000 to 50,200, this will be the choice in the majority of cases.)

Channel 1 on all CB sets is 26,965 MHz and a crystal of 23,035 would be needed for 50 MHz exactly. This is an oddball frequency, so check for a 23,000 MHz crystal in the junk box as this will work nicely.

The oscillator used in this project operates at the *fundamental* frequency of the crystal, and you should ensure that the correct frequency is generated when you



power it up! An overtone crystal may well be marked 23 MHz but it will actually oscillate at a fraction – a sub-multiple – of its marked frequency in this circuit!

Populating the board is pretty straightforward. Ensure that you do not deviate from the capacitor values as stated and keep all connections as short as possible.

The TX output power of the CB set must be turned down to no more than 100 mW otherwise saturation of the mixer will result

The gain of the pre-driver and linear amplifier added after the mixer board will determine the final output on 6 metres. I managed to scrounge the final out of a commercial "no name brand" VHF radio, biased it for SSB operation and am quite happy with the resulting 10 watts.

The linear amplifier that you select should also have its own antenna relay, the 'receive' contact of which should be connected to the terminal marked REC ANT on the mixer board.

If you wish to use the mixer just for receiving 6 metre signals, you can connect

your antenna direct to this point, of course.

ALIGNMENT

Receiver


Set the preset potentiometer to mid position. Select a channel on the CB set to receive an appropriate 6 metre signal, the frequency of which will be the sum of the oscillator and the CB frequency. A strong local station or beacon would be ideal.

Adjust the input trimmer (the 80pF capacitor at T1) for strongest received signal. The result should be very good.

Final tweaking of the CB's front end may improve the signal even further. (I made provision for adding a low noise preamp to my unit at a later stage but found this to be unnecessary).

Transmitter

Connect a frequency counter to the output of the TX mixer marked "To separate predriver". Switch the CB set to transmit in the AM mode. Adjust the 80pF transmit trimmer near T3 so that the counter displays a frequency in the 50 MHz range (depending on the crystal you have selected) thus ensuring that the filter



is suppressing the unwanted mixer frequencies.

To adjust the output to the exact frequency, each crystal should be selected in turn and its associated trimmer tweaked for an appropriate reading on the counter.


If a 50 MHz receiver is available and a small length of wire is attached to where the frequency counter was connected, you should be able to monitor yourself on the receiver.


Input and Output coils

The 6mm formers seen in the photograph were removed from an old Pye Westminster transceiver, but almost any 5 to 7 mm former would do as long as the pins line up with the PC board. The coils are not fitted with slugs.

Should sufficient interest be shown, I will consider publishing options for adding FM to the CB set and a complete linear

amplifier, including a pre-driver, that will be suitable for use with the mixer board described above.

- 10. Motions: Both motions were carried unanimously.
- 11. Report-back by Garth ZS2HB on the SARL AGM: The highlights of Garth's report-back were—
 - The format of the meeting was different to that in previous years, and there was also a different atmosphere.
 - There were 60 SARL members present, with 213 proxies.
 - The motion proposing that the SARL revert back to the previous structure having branches was lost. The meeting felt the present structure should be given a few years to prove its success or otherwise.
 - SARL membership is in a steady decline. Members need to be recruited to League membership as a matter of urgency.
 - A committee was set up to investigate whether there should be mandatory membership of the SARL
 - The SARL is working towards RAE examinations no longer being limited to fixed dates but exams being held whenever there is a predetermined minimum number of candidates ready to write.
 - HQ seem to have got their financial act together and trimmed their operating budget.
 - PEARS was singled out as one of the more progressive 'clubs'.

Chairman Chris thanked Garth for representing PEARS members at the AGM, and also for refusing any payment in respect of his travelling expenses.

12. General

- 1. Nicolas ZR2NDT gave a brier report on the activities of the younger members. Shawn ZR2SC also added a few words, and mentioned that more braais were in the pipeline.
- 2. Ken ZS2BWB made the point that PEARS membership had outgrown the capacity of the Civil Defence Centre that was used as our meeting place, and suggested it was time we started looking for another venue. Garth ZS2HB remembered seeing what could be a suitable venue at Telkom's college, and he would look into it.
- 3. Garth ZS2HB enquired when we would be putting up a 4m beacon. Mike ZS2FM said that there was sufficient space at the existing site of the 2m beacon. It was also mentioned that Ken ZS2OC had offered to donate a 70 MHz rig for this purpose.
- Closure: The meeting ended at 16:05, and members headed for the braai fires under idyllic weather condx.

FREE ID CARDS!

Bryan Haefele ZS2BH has offered to make, free of charge, small ID cards for members who attend PEARS functions to pin to their breast pockets or other suitable places. The cards bear the Society badge and the name and call sign of the member and they are laminated. (The cards, not the members).

Bryan is also able optionally to attach a plastic clip for use in place of a safety pin but he will need to recover the cost – about R1 at present – from those who require the device.

9U OUT OF DXCC LIST

The communications authorities in Burundi have declared as forgeries all

documentation regarding operations from that country (prefix 9U) since 1994. The ARRL DXCC body conducted its own investigation and has decided to remove from its records all contacts claimed with stations using a 9U prefix since 1994.

It is not known whether any operators have obtained DXCC on the strength of such contacts.

RAE ON 20 MAY

For the first time in a long while there are no entrants for the RAE in PE that we know of. Although a few people have made known their desire to get into Ham Radio, they came to us too late for the Society to arrange classes with any reasonable expectation of success.

REPEATER LINK TO CAPE TOWN

It seems the planned link to Cape Town is fraught with hassles. Chris Scarr ZS2AAW, together with pa Trevor ZS2AE and Lionel ZS2DD, travelled to George to improve the UHF link towards Riversdale, only to find that something seems to have gone wrong at that location. While signals appeared to be going westward from our side, no usable signal was being received from Riversdale.

Whatever the trouble was, it is sure to be licked soon, so keep an ear on the link for any strange voices.

NB: The improvements at George include the provision of a DTMF switch to exclude this repeater from the link when necessary. Please update your copy of the diagram in last month's QSX by inserting a heavy cross and the digits 7004 just below the George repeater icon marked "145.700", in similar fashion to the other repeaters.


Many members have expressed unhappiness over the quality of the transmissions and also the delivery by some readers. The question will be

Sunday Bulletins

PEARS bulletins are transmitted on Sundays immediately after the SARL English transmission, i.e. at about 08.45 on 7098 kHz as well as the 2 metre linked network that provides coverage from East London to George and environs as well as Cradock via the linked repeater system described above. PEARS' 7098 or 3640 kHz transceive facilities are also remotely linked as needed. In addition, the SARL's 40m transmissions on 7082 or 7066 kHz, alternatively 7070 kHz, can be remotely patched into the 2m network, either in receive-only mode or for full transceive capability for interactive events.
