Calling Back the Past

PEARS UHF - VHF contest over the 13 years on Oliphantskop Pass with ZS2BO & ZS2VDL

Where does one begin:

It all started when I stayed in Addo. I invited Alan ZS2BO to come with me for the day to Oliphantskop for the contest. So Saturday 22 January 2005 we went up the hill. We set up station (only



2 meters). We made 31 contacts that day. But yes we had to leave in a hurry, to every ones dismay as 6pm was nearing and the electrical storm was coming our way and we ducked off the mountain, like one would say tail between legs and run like hell. That was 2005

We decided to set up for the weekend, gazebo for comms room and kitchen etc and tent for sleeping. Friday night was bad, wind picked up and tent was hitting us on the

head. We had to fasten tent to trailer to protect us from the elements. We had 2 meters and 70 cm. Beams etc. but still not ful-

ly ready for what was coming going forward. That outing we made 85 contacts over the weekend.

2007

This was a game changer for us: 2 cars, 2 trailers lawnmower to make the place more comfortable for us and we were more prepared for what Mother Nature can throw at us. 2 big gazebos



put up against each other, tied with cable ties and shadow netting all the way round as well as canvas to protect us against rain and wind.

Setup was as fol-

lows Alan ZS2BO 2 meters, 70cm, 4 meters and 6 meters homemade beam antennas. ZS2VDL also 2 meters, 70cm, 4 & 6 meters beams as well as vertical antenna for guys in PE with vertical only. Oh yes don't

forget portable TV for watching cricket etc and movie Sunday night as we stayed on hill until Monday morning as there was no rush to get off mountain on Sunday afternoon.



Equipment: Lawn mower, batteries, solar panels generator for just in case. Food, beers, B&C (Alan) braai equipment, stretch-

ers, antennas, tent, gazebos, shadow netting, canvas for sides on gazebo for water proofing, rifle to keep baboons and monkeys away (never used), tables chairs, cooler boxes, frozen 2lt water bottles, solar lights to light up the area, portable toilet for comfort, hand held drill to drill holes into rocks to fasten antennas down, g as soldering irons and tools for just in case.

Over the years we had excitement and some scares.



Alan had radio pulled of the table due to a cow who decided to tangle itself with coax and runs away. Luckily no damage to radio. Needless to say the cow did not

come back Alan made sure of that.

Alan also had a mishap as his 70cm radio got moisture in it and packed up but switch cleaner did the trick. We made some good contacts over the years. ZS2CX in Knysna Mountain, Bonito on the South Coast, Nico in Bloem-

fontein, East London then the guys who went to Stutterheim from East London, Al who went to Grahamstown, Terry and Chris who went to Bedford, the guys



who set up stations at Zuurberg and all the rest. We thank them

all.

Other experiences on the mountain: An airplane came over from Paterson side but it sounded as if he misjudged the height of the hill and he flew over us not more than 50 meters high. Alan was rather verbal about that and I got up so quickly from my table I accidentally pushed the PTT on my desk top microphone and the incident was broadcasted on 2 meters so our incident was broadcasted live.

Then my fright.

One Saturday night around 10pm I had to go for a walk. As I pulled the shadow netting to one side a huge black ball came running up towards me and ran straight into the gazebo yes, I yelled (screamed). Alan jumped up as he did not comprehend the situation and the poor Bush Pig ran straight into a rock bounced off and disappeared into the night. Well I did not need to go for a walk anymore. I grabbed my rifle and stood watch at the entrance. Alan asked what the hell that I was doing. I said that was baby, mom and dad are still coming, I waiting for them. Needless to say nothing came and yes we had a few drinks smell pig was more. The of the bush overwhelming. AS the years progressed and the cost of fuel and the contacts got less and less over the years, we running off with the 1st place for field stations, and 13 years of doing the outing, we decided to hand over to the younger generation.

There are so many good memories of our 13 years on the Hill. To thank everyone personally will be impossible.

So to everyone who supported us over the years we say thank you and may the next generation who take over from us have sports like we did.

This is the SSB version of the contest so don't panic you won't need to know CW.

Now the Idea is to run 2 high powered Stations and for this to happen for a solid 48 hours we are going to need about 6 operators. Each operator will have to commit and be able to run unassisted for at least 3 hours at a time.

They will need to get to the venue at least for 2 shifts for both Saturday and Sunday. They also need to

own their own Headset, that is compatible with Yaesu Equipment. This is for hygiene reasons.
