Another year just about gone with some activity around the JAMTIN.

The QRZ log book is now 29 countries with 28 confirmed QSOs. The Italians are the most active with 10 contacts followed by the Germans with 7.

ZS2CJ, Chad, or as he is now known ON9CJ, is still elusive but hopefully he will come through soon from Belgium.

Apart from participation in various contests by ZS2G, ZS2EC and others, there were 2 events that were Jamtin highlights.

The first was the foxhunt antenna building technical workshop, the second was ZS2G's overnight stay to work some DX.

The foxhunt antenna building workshop was as a result of a very successful foxhunt run by ZS2GS and his brother from Cape Town.

ZS2VR provided the bill of materials and with the help of a few members the participants each built a very professional looking mini yagi antenna.

ZS2G's overnight DX started on the Saturday late afternoon with the building of a 40m antenna with radials laid out on the ground. We were joined by ZS2DL who made some CW contacts. Over the next hours ZS2OD made some local contacts and ZS2G managed to contact Indonesia.

Sunday morning, I returned to the Jamtin, ZS2G had moved to the 15m antenna. ZS2OD made her first DX contact to a ham in Germany. I continued calling CQ and made 2 difficult QSO's to France.

After the second QSO, a very strong signal came through from a ham with a very Australian accent. He has a VK callsign so it wasn't France. Turns out it was VK5KI on Kangaroo Island on the Eastern side of Australia. We were on the long path to Australia. One of those anomalies of the ham hobby.

Remember, Jamtin is available for all hams. I am there most Fridays from about 16h00/19h00+. I also try and post my DX contacts on the Technical WhatsApp group so if you are in your shack, you can try make contact as well.

ZS2BK's Road to Satellite DXCC and VUCC

Hi, here is just some history of my passion for Sats Ops. Lic'ed in 1975 and from early days a great interest in Amateur Sats. My 1st Sat was Oscar 6 and AO-7 after I acquired VHF/UHF SSB/CW equipment to work through AO-7.

In those early days there were not any cell phones with Apps or Internet for predictions or doppler control of the Rig's frequencies . All manual VFO control to counter the doppler effect which on UHF and LEO Sat the swing from start to finish (AOS to LOS) of a pass can be as much as 18khz. So if no doppler adjustment is done you loose the other station very quickly.

You ran your own predictions all text (no graphics) from weekly keplerian elements you copied from W1AW in CW. Then entered these Keps into your Prediction program written in Basic or Fortran producing reams of paper indicating the particular chosen Sat to track in terms of Date/Time and Azim/elevation where to point your yagi's to and track the Sat.

Thanks to progress and availability of new technologies we now use a mouse and click for quick and automated Keplarian updates.

So even with all this progress and development in Satellites since my introduction in 1975, its still taken me 48yrs to achieve DXCC Sats (oribiting no GEO) currently at #108 entities and VUCC Sats currently at #270 Grids ZS #1.

For the past 5yrs I have lived in a retirement village with all its restrictions and challenges but still manage my daily activity on the birds.

CU on the Sats sometime.

HALFWAVE VERTICAL ANTENNA



The parallel tuned circuit is easy to construct from material in the junk box. The antenna works exceptionally well and no ground plane radials are required.

The half wave radiator is constructed from any copper wire and cable tied to any non metal material like wood or pvc pipe. I used a piece of Indian cane.

The tuned circuit consists of a coil of .68 micro henry and a variable capacitor or trimmer of 25-30pf.

The centre of the feedline (rg58 is fine) is tapped onto the coil from the earth end, at about 3 turns. Find the best match by trial and error. Adjust the trimmer for lowest swr. I managed 1.2 swr on the one I built.



The coil was air wound using 1.4mm copper wire (not critical) on a 16mm piece of pipe, as a former. Total length of the coil was 30mm. The pipe is then discarded.

The coil and cap was housed in a plastic box, normally used for joining pvc conduit piping. Seal the box with silicon or rubberised glue to keep moisture out. A so239 socket can be mounted on the box, or the coax cable can be soldered directly to the components.

Hope to hear some new call signs soon on 70,2mhz.The 4m net is active every Monday evening from 1900 SAST.
