From the JAMTIN.....

The new year is not so new anymore, at this stage we are already in mid February 2024 and it looks like another year is going to fly by.

The Jamtin and its technology remains simple but very effective. 100w on the ICOM 7300 coupled to the 2 element 15m Yagi continues to surprise on the DX front.

To date we have contacted most of the European countries as well as East Europeans. Canada is popping up more and more our latest contact was with VE2PEP Germain in Quebec City.

Success lies in having a half decent radio coupled to a very decent, well-tuned antenna. We make contact with hams all over the world. Some of them have sophisticated equipment, amplifiers boosting their signals into the Kilowatt range. So powerful that even though they are in the Northern hemisphere with antennae pointing East-West or West-East, their signal reaches down to the tip of Africa. We respond to them and they turn the antenna South and suddenly everything is a good 59.

The ZS2JIM QRZ log book is now 36 countries with 45 confirmed QSOs. South America still eludes us. I need to speak to ZS2G to find direction and best time to throw a line towards South America.

Jamtin will be operating for the SARL uhf/vhf contest 9-10 March, there will also be members out in the field in Kouga

Remember, Jamtin is available for all hams. I am there most Fridays from about 16h00/19h00+. We have battery backup and can operate for the 2 hours of loadshedding.

REPLACEMENT OF POLARIZED FILM ON A ICOM IC-706MIIG

For several months the LCD display on my IC-706MIIG has been getting worse, the appearance is a big blotch on the LCD and makes reading the display difficult. This is normally caused by excessive light exposure such as the sun. I only use this rig in the field for SOTA, field days etc.

I contacted Donavon, ZS2DL, and asked how one can rectify or replace the screen. After receiving some guidance, the first step is to purchase polarized LCD film, and it must be the adhesive type. The sheets normally come in A4 size.



The sheets were ordered from the US, and 9 days later they arrived. But the task at hand is not so simple. Below is an outline of the process in order to replace the existing factory screen film.

The picture left is the unit before any work is carried out. The first step is to remove the back cover, there are two small screws. Then remove the dials in

front, and screw off the nuts on each knob attached to the cover. The photo below shows the unit now reading for the removal process of the screen.

Remove the silver cover holding the screen in place. It is held down with clips on


the metal frame. Once done, the screen can be removed, however, it is extremely important to note that there are two communication strips on either side of the screen. You have to make sure that the way they came out is the way the go back in! Otherwise you are going to end up with a screen that will not work.






Now we can get to work on the screen. Start by removing the film on the display as shown below.

Next is to remove the very sticky residue that is sitting on the screen. I used pure alcohol and fibre optic cleaning wipes to do this. Apply



the alcohol and rub it into the residue. Take a carpet knife blade and gently start removing the sticky bits. Be careful not to scratch the screen. The screen has to be

completely free of this residue.

And now the test......the screen looks brand new and the rig is ready to go!
