From the JAMTIN.....

Not too much happening at the Jamtin during the past few weeks. QRZ now shows 50 confirmed QSO's in 43 countries. So ZS2JIM has got a way to go still.

What did happen last month was an event called the Addo Trail Run. Was slightly different this year, there is a lot of development happening in that part of Addo so the organisers had to change the route. For our check point team, it meant moving from the top of a ridge, where we had good comms, to the valley where we had no comms. This meant setting up a cross band repeater close to our old spot and testing this as we drove into the valley.

This set up worked so well that I was able to hit our repeater with a handheld and have the freedom to walk around the check point. And that's where the comedy of errors started.

At some point I decided to put my handheld on top of my vehicle while I worked in the campsite. Then my XYL remembered that I asked her to move the vehicle to make more space. Radio falls off vehicle and gets run over. It still sort of worked but the screen didn't survive. So, it was back to main rig.

Next comedy involved one of our CP helpers deciding to unfold her faithful camping chair and relax. Chair decided no and collapsed. Then it was the XYL's turn, she somehow got the vehicle's key slammed in the door. The electronic bits of the key shot out into the

long grass. After some frantic searching we found all the bits, clipped everything back together and thank goodness it worked.

Our last scene was whilst dismantling the large event gazebo for set up for the event. This involves pulling the pipe frame apart. These pipes are linked with an elasticised chain so they stay together while you fold them up. Our intrepid helper pulls the pipes apart, the chain breaks and shoots into his hand. My first knowledge of this is when my XYL calls me to bring the first aid kit. Quite a bit of blood involved, so wash off, dry and apply bandage.

Apart from these small interruptions the event went off well. Comms were excellent across the check points and as always, the organisers were extremely grateful for PEARS assistance.

These events are a lot of fun, you get to go to places the general public never goes and camp in some magnificent areas. And at the same time play radio. I would encourage anyone who has not been part of these events to make enquiries and join the fun. Speak to ZR2TX Tony Allen or any of the committee members.



First TEP contact at 144 MHz made from Mauritius - 9th Apr 2024


On the **9th of April 2024**, 3B8FA in Mauritius made the first Trans-Equatorial Propagation (TEP) contact on the **144 MHz** band from that country when he completed a contact with A65BR in the UAE. As the screen grab shows above, there was also a path to A71XX in Qatar.




This screen capture below from Oleg, A65BR shows the contact on the Q65 mode.



FR4OO on Reunion Island also had the same TEP as the previous day to A65BR, A71XX and 9K2GS.





Just to keep the report as complete as possible, there was also a path from FR5DN to Qatar...

Looking at the maps, there is almost certainly a TEP path from Madagascar (5R) north to Kuwait but it just needs someone to be active from that country.
